2023 brought record regatta participation and performance.

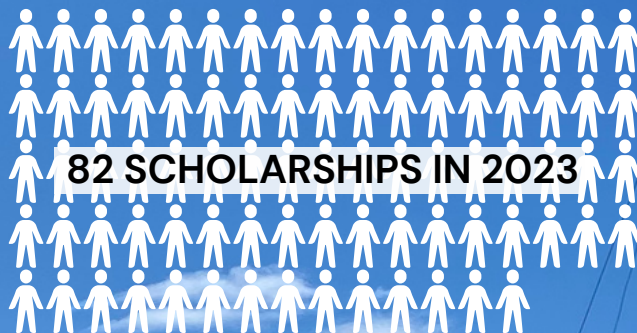
Hire and develop new staff members

FOR THE KIDS

Gig Harbor Junior Sailing is wrapping up its 14th year of providing a safe, fun, and educational environment for the healthy development of youth through sailing. From our humble beginnings, we are now on a even keel both financially and in programming —so our eyes are on the future!

2023 was a banner year with over 600 students in Sail Camp, and 40 racers on Narrows Race Team. We are grateful to the tremendous group of instructors, coaches, 14 member board and community partners who are increasingly attracted to the outstanding reputation of Gig Harbor Junior Sailing. We are fortunate to have 2 full-time staff (Sailing Director, Ashley Nelson, and Assistant Sailing Director, Niko Twilla) who provide strong, positive experiences for youth, families, and staff.

We are most proud of an unprecedented \$38,000 in scholarships provided for underserved youth in 2023, thanks to generous grants and donations. This allowed so many youth to learn water safety and the joy and confidence of being in control of their own boat—from rigging to launching and sailing!

This year we took some huge leaps into the future of GHJS:

- We took “Yacht Club” out of our name (in collaboration with GHYC) to reflect our separate organization with no financial or legal relationship to GHYC. So we are now: Gig Harbor Junior Sailing!
- We partnered with Boys and Girls Club of South Puget Sound to provide a week of Sail Camp for 20 kids from Tacoma!
- We began a Capital Campaign bringing in new volunteers with expertise and enthusiasm to pursue financing for a permanent on-the-water location.

The 2023 annual Dinner Auction, our only fundraiser, provided vital boats and equipment for the program. An amazing group of adult and Narrows Race Team racers – an all-volunteer effort – once again put on a tremendous celebration of GHJS and raised \$109,000! As one Auction volunteer stated, “I support Junior Sail because all the hard work and community donations are used exclusively to give kids the opportunity to get out on the water!”


GH Junior Sailing would not exist were it not for the amazing support we receive from so many:

- Stan Stearns family provides Gig Harbor Junior Sailing space to operate at West Shore Marina
- Tacoma Yacht Club partners with us, providing space and equipment for use in programming managed and staffed by GHJS

- Gig Harbor Yacht Club allows us to use their facility for meetings and at a discount for the Auction.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

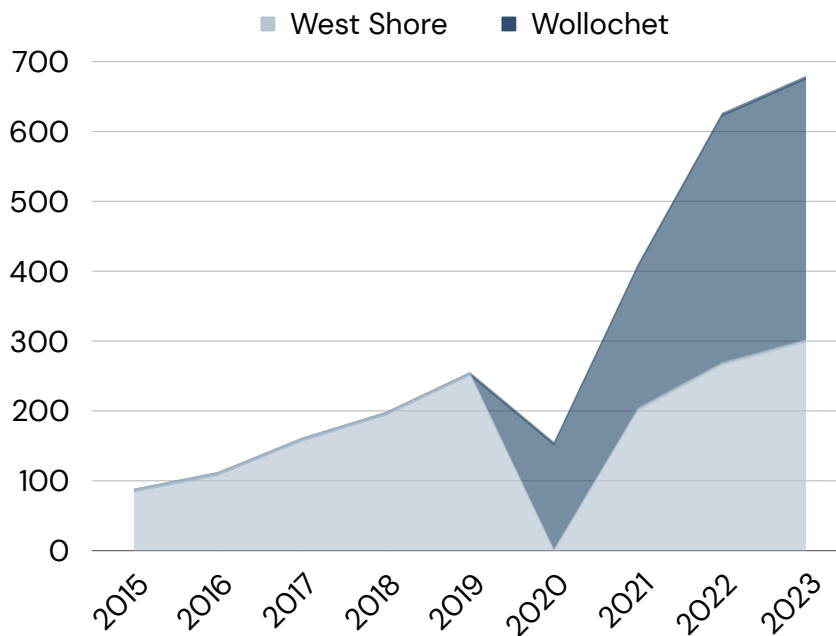
2023 Summer Sail Camp programs benefitted from the expertise of our returning instructors. New staff approached their first summer with a growth mindset, and the result was incredible mentorship and a stellar camp experience for our 677 participants. We are excited to continue to develop and refine our camp programs, and get new sailors out on the water again next year.

In 2023 we expanded our Opti Intermediate classes and added Advanced ILCA and c420 classes to provide a challenge for returning campers. We also expanded our Jellyfish classes to include more young excited sailors than ever before.

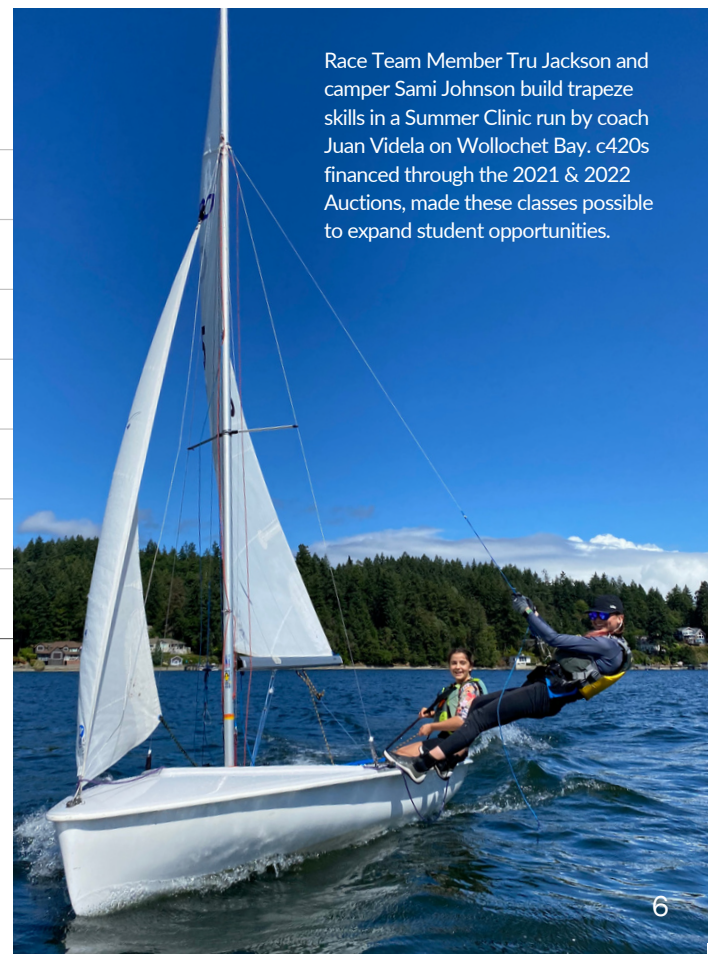

BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF SOUTH PUGET SOUND PARTNERSHIP



In July, Gig Harbor Junior Sailing and The Boys and Girls Clubs of South Puget Sound partnered to provide camps for underserved youth who otherwise would not have had the opportunity to sail. Staff members from both programs worked together to coordinate, build comfort amongst participants, and transport sailors to and from Tacoma.

With the support of the TK Foundation Spirit Fund, Gig Harbor Junior Sailing provided full scholarships and sailing instruction. The Boys and Girls Club of South Puget Sound provided member outreach & transportation via their club vans as well as program staff at camp each day. This unique partnership allowed 20 participants to get sailing.

The highlight of the week was the weekly camp sail to lighthouse beach. Sailors were enamored with their beach treasures, and staff were reminded what a special place we have to sail in each day.

This program is a first step in reducing barriers to the sport of sailing and access to outdoor recreation for underserved youth. We are excited to continue this program in the coming year and were thrilled to provide 20 youth with a great week at camp.

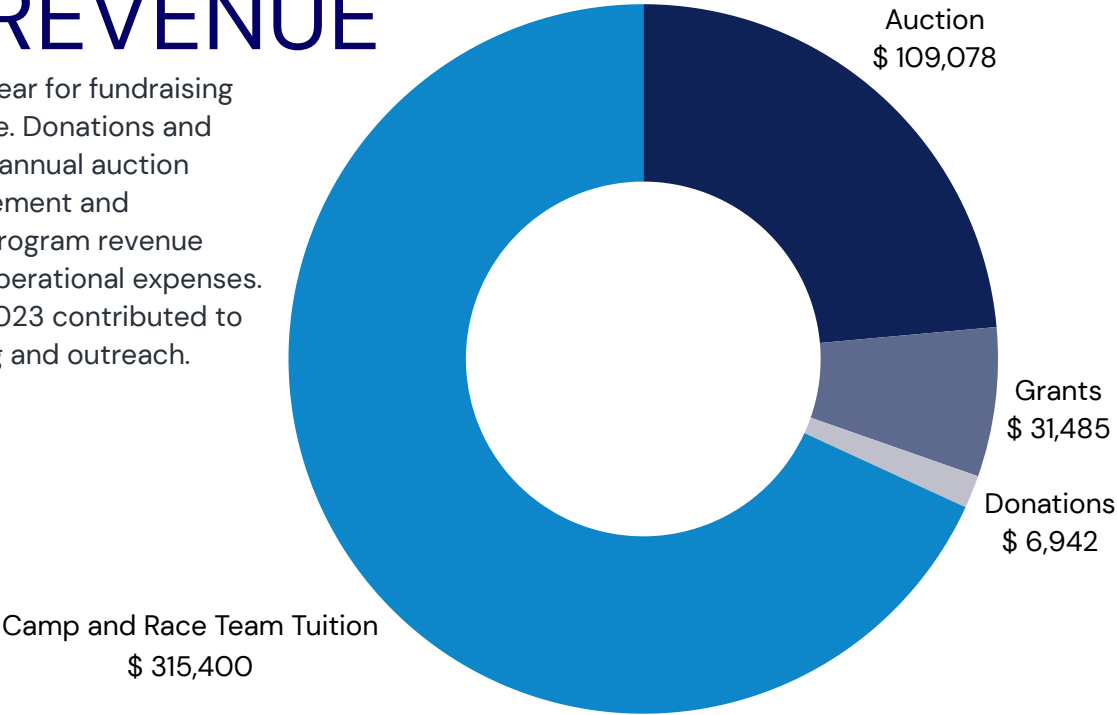

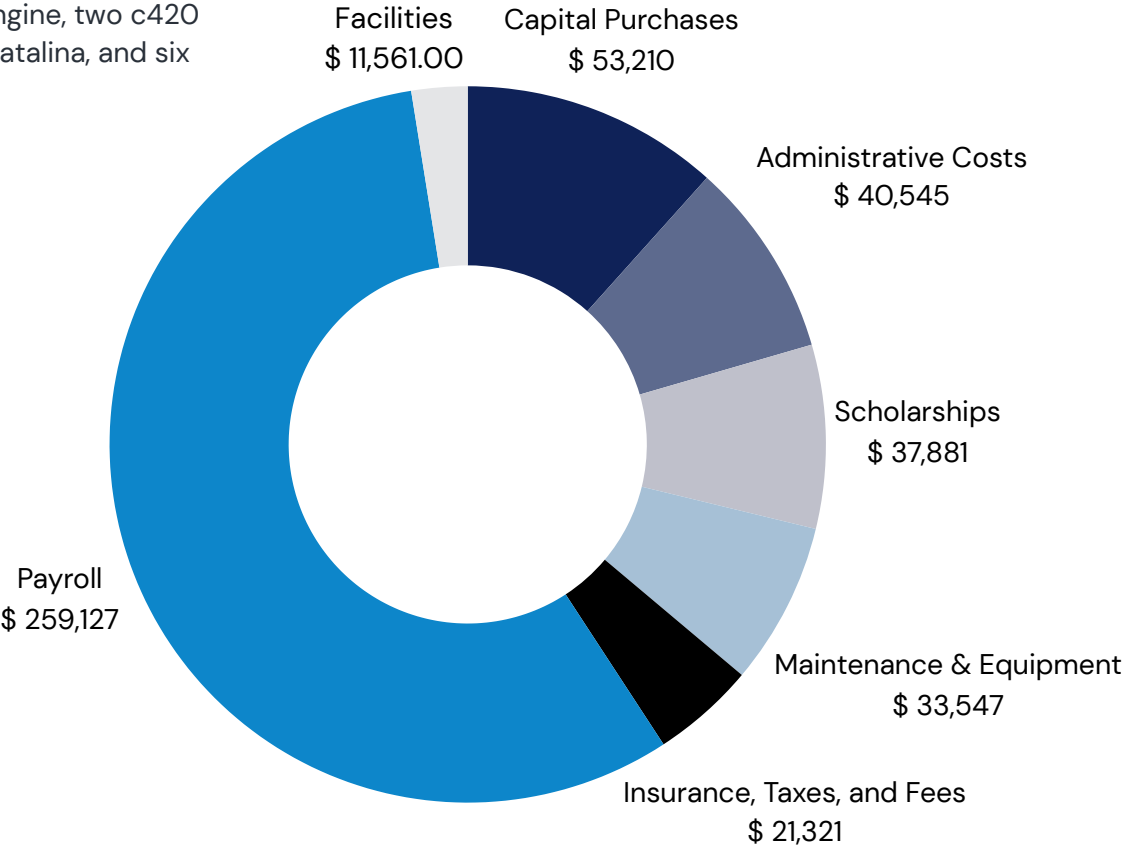
2023 REVENUE

2023 was a record year for fundraising and program revenue. Donations and money raised at our annual auction support fleet replacement and scholarships, while program revenue covers payroll and operational expenses. Grants received in 2023 contributed to scholarships, training and outreach.



2023 EXPENSES

Capital Purchases included: 16' rigid-inflatable safety boat, 15' Boston Whaler safety boat, 25HP safety boat replacement engine, 50HP safety boat replacement engine, two c420 trailers, 4HP outboard for Catalina, and six sets of FJ race sails



RACE TEAM

In 2023, we focused our race program efforts toward building skills and getting as many sailors as possible to regattas. Sailors benefited from an exceptional coaching roster, and made the most of equipment funded through our annual auction.

Parents supported race programming by going above and beyond to recruit and house coach Juan Videla who traveled to Gig Harbor to coach from Argentina. We were also lucky to add veteran Opti Coach Andrew Nelson to our summer roster. Both coaches pushed sailors to new levels of competition this summer and helped to create a strong foundation for future programs.

Gig Harbor Junior Sailing operates the Narrows Race Team with support from Tacoma Yacht Club. We share sailors, coaching, venues and equipment in order to get local kids racing.

This partnership had its most successful year as we were able to send the highest number of participants to compete in the Northwest Youth Racing Circuit Summer Series. A total of 40 sailors set a record number of 111 regatta entries in 2023 summer events. A big thanks to coaches, Andrew Nelson, Juan Videla, Jake Tiedeman, and Niko Twilla for getting our kids racing safely all summer long.

Our Scholastic High School Sailing Program focused on growth and team-building this year. Sailors competed from many area high schools with Gig Harbor High School and Bellarmine Preparatory set to build robust rosters in the coming years. Sailors also competed representing SAMI, Maritime, and Peninsula.

Opti and Junior Varsity programs have operated at steady numbers in 2023 with the region working toward a more consistent fall and spring competition season.

Thank you to fall and spring coaches; Niko Twilla, Ashley Nelson, Tommy Holmberg and Ellie Ungar.

The team is poised to blossom in the coming years as sailors take on new challenges, pursue opportunities, and push each other to grow.

ILCA & C420 RACE TEAM

Our ILCA sailors benefitted from another excellent clinic with coach Paul Swan this summer. Sailors Camryn Lee and Danny Cheng-Sun traveled to Rhode Island to compete in US Junior Women's Championships. Our c420 program built incredible momentum with all six boats traveling to almost every NWYRC Summer Series Event. c420 sailors also enjoyed the addition of the c420 to the annual WIND Clinic in Cascade Locks, Oregon in July.



OPTI RACE TEAM

Six dedicated Opti Champ sailors worked toward the top of the fleet throughout the summer. With Coach Andrew Nelson leading the charge, we saw momentum build for our Opti Champ Fleet. Sailors rose to the challenge, attending WIND Clinic with the highest participation rate ever. Sailors are pushing the program forward by attending travel events, area clinics, and taking advantage of every opportunity to race and build skills. Assistant Sailing Director Niko Twilla has offered continuity and development for this program over the past two years allowing a stable foundation for future seasons.

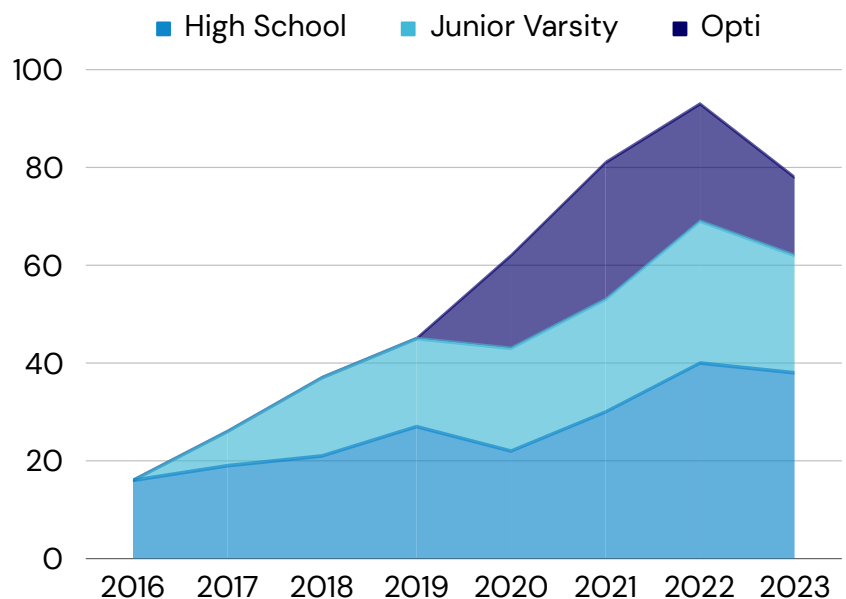


JUNIOR VARSITY PROGRAM

Our Junior Varsity Program continued to provide racing experience and the opportunity for younger sailors to develop skills. Sailors competed in regional events in fall and spring and the Northwest Youth Racing Circuit in the summer.

HIGH SCHOOL SAILING

In 2023 we were able to further develop partnerships with Gig Harbor High School and Bellarmine Preparatory School, allowing athletes to earn varsity letters in sailing for the first time. Twelve athletes received letters for varsity participation in Spring of 2023. We continue to build teams and strive to get every sailor on the water each season. Sailors continue to build school programs and successful recruitment efforts have already had a positive impact on team performance and culture.

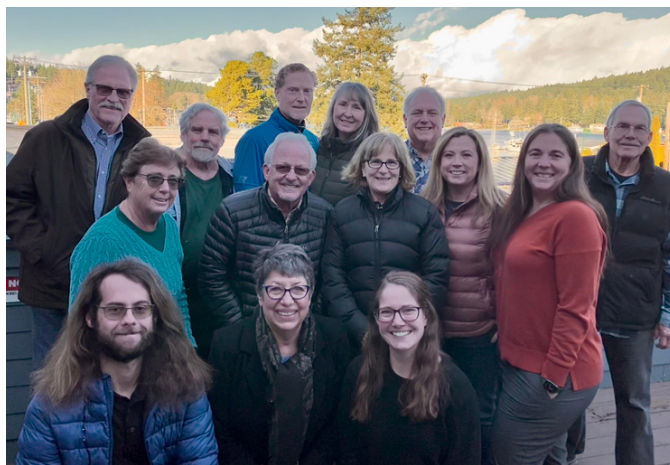

2024 PROGRAM GOALS

Fund scholarship program of at least \$35,000 through donations and grants

In 2023, we saw the highest ever demand for scholarships, and we expect higher demand in 2024. We are proud to provide access to the sport for all youth in our community, regardless of ability to pay. In 2024, we hope to secure grants and donations to fund scholarships that meet the demand in our community.

Maintain and develop partnerships with local organizations, including The Boys and Girls Clubs of South Puget Sound and local schools.

We plan to operate our partnership week with The Boys and Girls Club of South Puget Sound again in 2024. We also plan to expand our involvement in school and community events.

Develop and formalize internship and volunteer opportunities for youth

We are proud to provide job skills and employment opportunities to local youth. In the coming year we plan to expand and develop our Youth Internship and Junior Instructor opportunities.

A SECURE FUTURE

Our goal is to secure a permanent waterfront location to ensure the future of the Gig Harbor Junior Sailing Program

Year-over-year we have met our enrollment goals, solidified our partnerships and established a firm financial footing. We are now in a strong position to plan for a sustainable future by securing a permanent on-the-water location for our organization.

Half of GHJS's program is delivered at West Shore Marina, Gig Harbor, in space generously provided by the Stearns Family. Additional sailing camps and race programming are operated on Wollochet Bay out of a facility owned by Tacoma Yacht Club. Our partnership with Tacoma Yacht Club is strong and we will continue facilitating programming at this facility into the future. Pen Met Parks provides space at Peninsula Garden's greenhouses where we store our fleet in the off season and complete necessary maintenance. These spaces, provided by our community, are key to the success in delivering GHJS programming. However, none of these spaces provide a permanent long-term home for the program. Securing dockage and a waterfront facility will enable us to continue making a positive impact on our community.

At the end of 2023, a Capital Campaign Committee was formed whose sole purpose is to identify potential opportunities and to lay the groundwork for fundraising and grant efforts. Our roots are in Gig Harbor, leading us to focus our search in Gig Harbor and the surrounding area. A feasibility study is underway that will guide the board's evaluation of opportunities as they arise.

Throughout 2024 we look forward to charting our course to sail into the FUTURE.
